Classroom Rules

Classroom condus

1. You should be in your seats and ready to begin when bell rings.

2. You should have notebook, calculator, and pencil ready when class begins.

3. When I am talking, you are not to be talking, especially during instruction. Consequences: 1. Verbal warning 2. detention and call home 3. Office referral 4. Removal from class.

Cell phones

1. Your cell phone is not to be out during class, especially during instruction. Consequences: 1. Verbal warning to put it away. 2. I will ask for the phone and return at end of class, and call home 3. Failure to give me phone, is a referral to the office.

Assignments

1. On guided practice, independent practice, class projects, tests, and quizzes, you are to show all of your appropriate work (the steps on solving the problems as done in class). Full credit will not be awarded if work is not shown. On assessments, partial credit is awarded with appropriate work being shown, when the answer is not correct. This helps a lot of students in their grades.

2. The first practice assignments are graded based completion. Full points are awarded based on completion of the assignment (on time) with appropriate work being shown. If work is not shown or is copied no or partial credit will be awarded.

3. You may make up assignments, which you have missed. But, it is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to do so. Make up assignments are available. Full credit will be awarded only if there is an excused absence from school.

If you skip class or do not complete assigned work, it is a 0 until it is made up. When you make it up, a maximum of 50 % of the points is available. So, you need to be in class, on time, and complete the needed assignments.

Quizzes and tests can be made up if you are absent from class, but it is your responsibility to make sure that you have made ut up in a timely fashion. The grade will be a 0 (a big hunt to your overall grade) until it is made up. Quizzes can be made up after all current work is made up for the day of return, and should be made up after school (make arrangements with Mr. Podis)

Quizzes and tests can only be taken in the classroom with Mr. Podis or a substitute teacher, so if you are removed from class, you will have to make the quiz up after school. You may do so for full credit, but it may be a longer version of he assessment

Consequences for misconduct

1. Consequences for various things are given under the correct section, and will be enforced.

2. Consequences for other forms of misconduct will follow something like this. 1. Verbal warning or being asked to move to another seat. (refusing to move if asked means removal from class) 2. Detention to be served the next day and a phone call home. 3. Referral to the office 3. Removal from class.

Restroom or other passes

1. Restroom passes are given based work and effort engaging in the classroom tasks. If you have not made progress and cooperated in completing the classroom tasks. If the teacher feels that progress has been made (answering questions, written work, cooperation) then you may have a restroom pass.

2. If you abuse the privilege, by taking too long or interrupting other classes, your privileges will be revoked until further notice.

3. There is a restroom pass. Be sure to bring it back, or you could cost others the privilege. There is only one student out at anytime, so abusing passes will hurt yourself and others

Tardy to class

1. Being on time to class, means that you are in the classroom when the bell rings.

2. If you are tardy to class, you will need to have a pass to be allowed into class. If you do not have one, you will sent out to get one. If you do not return, you are cutting class, and a slip will be sent to office and all consequences on make-up work apply.

3. Habitual tardiness will result in a phone call home, and an office referra

Food and Drinks in clas

1. There are no food or drinks allowed in class, except perhaps a water bottle. If this gets abused, this too can be removed. Consequences: 1. Verbal warning (asked to put food away) 2. An office referral and phone call home. 3. Removal from class.

Dismissal from class

1. You are dismissed from class when Mr. Podis dismisses you (not the bell). Mr. Podis is looking for you to be quiet and seated, as well for all class materials to be put away. Any paper or other items on the floor must be picked up. Leaving before dismissal will result in a detention, and further incidences will be a referral to the office. If necessary, a removal from class will be issued, beginning the next day.

Special Privilege days

1. On certain Fridays (not every Friday), the class can earn a special privalege day. There must be a 75 % work completion and submission rate for the class for the week. On these days 1. You may have s-10 minutes free at the end of class. 5. For double periods, you may have a 4 minute break in the classroom.

2. On these days, students who have a 90 % work completion and submission rate for the week and no referrals or detentions for the week, will have a snack given to them by Mr. Podis.

3. Abuse of the privilege can result in the terms being changed or even the privilege revoked.
